

HEAD START ENGAGING STUDENTS, PARENTS DURING PANDEMIC CLOSURE

Once again our families partnered with us here at UCHRA Van Buren County Head Start during the COV-19 shutdown and engaged their talents as their child's first and lifelong teachers by completing and sending back to us their educational and health activities distributed to them by our staff weekly during our nutrition and educational distribution.

Each week our families received a food distribution consisting of a six-day protein, fruit, and drink pack. Our staff made the weekly distributions directly to our family's homes, following social distancing rules, leaving supplies for families to retrieve at their convenience. Our families supported our endeavors with a 90 percent return ratio of distributed health/educational materials. The Tree Study proved to be a favorite of our children with returned stories, pictures, and puppets.

Also, the "My Coronavirus Capsule',' which was a suggestion of one of our parents, was met with enthusiasm. Along with weekly family contacts via phone by our staff, inquiries were made and additional assistance supplied as needed. Weekly access availability of storytime and nutritional/educational videos via our website as well as additional educational opportunities for families were offered through our curriculum-based online resource, ensuring our children received support during the entire shutdown.

We are also offering a Summer Enrichment Program in June where children will attend school at the facility and receive one-on-one intensified teaching/individualization providing them additional opportunities for academic success.
