UCHRA TO ASSIST 156 PUTNAM CO. FAMILIES WITH TORNADO RELIEF FUNDS



Approximately one week after first publicly announcing the Agency had received a \$15,000 grant from United Way, UCHRA announced today it would essentially pause accepting applications after exceeding funds with the applications received so far.

Those gift cards can be used to purchase food, fuel, cleaning supplies, and other items survivors may need in the days, weeks, and months ahead. AAAD PARTNERS WITH WARREN CO. RESTAURANTS TO PROVIDE, DELIVER MEALS TO SENIORS AMID COVID-19

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, communities are pulling together resources to best meet the needs of their residents. The Area Agency on Aging and Disability (AAAD) is working with Warren County restaurants to meet the nutritional needs of older adults and those with physical disabilities. Those restaurants include Wild Bill's BBQ and Grill, Warren County Home Delivery, Warren County/McMinnville Senior Center, and Warren County Helping Hands.

Each day, these facilities prepare meals which are then delivered by volunteers. Wild Bill's restaurant provides 20 hot, home-delivered meals per day to seniors including some who are homeless and temporarily living in a hotel. Warren County Home Delivery and the McMinnville Senior Center prepare each prepare more than 200 meals per day. Each week, Warren County Helping Hands delivers cases of frozen meals to the homes of 20 low-income seniors. All meals are being provided at no cost to the Warren County residents.

These partnerships, along with volunteer support, help ensure our communities' most vulnerable population receives the services they need during this challenging time.
