SAS PROGRAM TAPPED TO ASSIST CITY OF COOKEVILLE, POLICE DEPT


UC HRA Substance Abuse Solutions

The City of Cookeville has approved an agreement with the Substance Abuse Solutions (SAS) program administered by Upper Cumberland Human Resource Agency (UCHRA) to facilitate access to social services to individuals in need within the city. UCHRA/SAS personnel

within the city. UCHRA/SAS personnel will provide on-call service to assist the Cookeville Police Department and other city personnel in engaging individuals in need of social services; allowing police officers to focus more on calls that are directed to law enforcement needs rather than social service duties. Current programs and services offered by UCHRA include two-generational programs, lowincome home energy assistance and weatherization programs, commodities, transportation, and rent assistance. SAS works to connect individuals affected by substance use and abuse to long-term treatment programs, including inpatient/outpatient treatment, employment, housing, food, clothing, counseling, legal aid, as well as mental and physical health resources.
