This year we are partnering with Tennessee Technological University to offer a Caregiver Simulation course for students. This project will allow students to "step into the shoes" of family caregivers and see some challenges they face each day when it comes to caring for loved ones. Earning the 2014 Sundance Audience Award, Alive Inside follows social worker Dan Cohen on his quest to bring personalized music to nursing homes.

Upon hearing songs from their past, seniors with

dementia are suddenly able to find a joyous sense of self that had been lost. We will be showing this movie at this year's expo event from 10:45 a.m. until 12:15 p.m.
