


The Cannon County Senior Center's Silver Sneakers Boom class has recently begun a new activity: Ball Drumming.

WORK UNDERWAY ON TANF PLANNING GRANT




Work is well underway on the TANF Opportunity Act planning grant by UCHRA and its key collaborative partners.

APPLICATION FOR HOME REHAB PROGRAM AVAILABLE FOR SPARTA RESIDENTS

There will be an application workshop for the HOME Rehabilitation Program on Feb. 1 at 5:30 p.m. at Sparta City Hall. The purpose of this workshop is to inform residents about the eligibility requirements for this program and to review the application process with homeowners.

HOME program funding is intended to help families of low-income who cannot afford to bring their homes up to code. Rehabilitation can include fixing leaking plumbing, unsafe flooring, faulty wiring, damaged roofs, and more.

Helping these individuals with basic home improvements and repairs will make their homes much safer and improve their quality of life. Repairing these homes also improves the value of the neighborhood and preserves the amount of affordable housing available. This program is for City of Sparta residents only.
