	CSBG UPDATE  LANELLE GODSEY,  COMMUNITY SERVICES DIRECTOR		
DISCUSSION	LaNelle Godsey presented and reported on the UCHRA Dashboard for February, and March, 2022.  • The agency is currently out of the regular Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) funds but we expect to receive additional funds soon.  • The agency has a small amount of Crisis LIHEAP funding.  • Training will be held April 21, 2022 on the Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program. There will be three categories that the agency can serve: Households that have been disconnected or pending disconnection services; Households who are behind on their water bills; and households that are just seeking help for water bills. If clients qualify for LIHEAP, they will qualify for the water program. For individuals seeking assistance with their water bills, there will be a one time \$250.00 payment. The agency cannot make repairs or pay to extend pipes. The agency can help

Currently the funds are not reoccurring but there is discussion that if the program is successful there is potential that it may be reoccurring.  • The agency received the monitoring results for the Community Services Block Grant (CSBG) Program and there were no findings for the previous year.

	PROGRAM UPDATES EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MARK FARLEY			
DISCUSSION	Executive Director Mark Farley recognized Adam Knepp, UCHRA employee. During a commodities event in Cumberland County, a volunteer experienced a choking episode. Adam was able to assist the person in performing the Heimlich. Executive Director Mark Farley expressed his appreciation and thanked him for his hard work and his quick response.			
	Executive Director Mark Farley advised that transportation department does a lot of TennCare work. The agency works with brokers that are hired through TennCare. The agency received a very sizeable increase in revenue streams and			

	we feel that he agency is in a stronger position to match grant dollars.		
	Executive Director Mark Farley advised that he and Megan Spurgeon presented the TANIF presentation to the committee. The committee will be meeting April 21st to decide who will be awarded the TANIF funding.		
DISCUSSION	Executive Director Mark Farley advised that the State Department of Corrections is looking at making changes to the Community Corrections Program. The State is requesting that the agency create Day Reporting Centers. UCHRA is proposing to create three centers, one in each of the three judicial districts the agency covers (Putnam, Warren, and Smith counties). The proposal will be submitted to the State in May. If the proposal is approved the program will start July 1st.		
	Chairman Randy Heady thanked Executive Director Mark Farley, Megan Spurgeon and the team that put so much work into the TANIF project.
