REGAINING INDEPENDENCE THROUGH UCHRA'S IN-HOME SERVICES

Before 82-year-old Charlie Brown first began receiving support and assistance through UCHRA, he could not grocery shop for himself, cook certain meals, or sweep and mop his floors. Charlie, who is blind, relied on his neighbor to assist with shopping and needed help doing things that he was otherwise unable to do on his own. Since working with Charlie, Linda Barker, UCHRA homemaker aide, has been able to help Charlie with tasks around the home and also connect him with blind services that make it easier for Charlie to live independently.

With Linda's help, Charlie has also since gotten in touch with a local church that delivers hot meals three times a week. He now has tools to help him with a variety of daily tasks including those that make accessing books, magazines, and the bible easier for him.

"I am able to live independently and stay in my home," he said. "I can read my bible which is something I love and missed doing."
